DROPLESS CATARACT PROCEDURE



This safe, effective, and state-of-the-art approach to Cataract Surgery is saving our patients time and money! Historically, the patient had to use several different drops for a month following surgery. Not only was this difficult to keep track of but often very expensive. The burden of after surgery drop care is a thing of the past at Michigan Eye!!

We take great pride in offering proven, advanced technology to ensure our patients get the best visual results possible!

Please note, this method is determined per patient. Your surgeon may use dropleless or partial dropleless methods. If you are prescribed drops, this was a decision by your surgeon to best treat your specific case.

What to expect with the dropleless or partial dropleless methods:

- ✓ You may notice broken blood vessels at the injection site. This will resolve on its own over several days.
- ✓ You may notice a small, white bubble on the lower white of your eye, about the size of a grain of rice. This is the medication. The medication bubble will disburse and be absorbed by your eye over a matter of weeks. Please see the pictures to the right as a reference of **normal** injection sites.



MEI strongly urges individuals to not touch their eyes or lids in an attempt to self-examine. Please do not attempt to locate this medication. Important to know it is normal, if you do notice it.
